Project Pericles works with presidents, provosts, faculty, staff, and students to support political and democratic engagement across all levels of the institution.

This new position of **Deputy Director** will play a pivotal role in shaping our future. This critical multi-faceted leadership position will expand Project Pericles' capacity to address urgent concerns that lie at the intersection of civic engagement, social justice/responsibility, and higher education's mission to serve the public good.

The current times demonstrate the crucial need for students to embrace their role and responsibility in making a difference in society. Project Pericles is uniquely positioned to address the need by supporting higher education's civic mission and commitment to collective action. It is essential that the Deputy Director brings enthusiasm, a commitment to democracy, and will "hit the ground running" to support our vital work. The Deputy Director reports to the Executive Director and has supervisory responsibilities. The ideal candidate will be an experienced, ambitious, creative, goal-oriented leader with a hearty sense of humor and willingness to work collaboratively with talented and committed colleagues across the country.

Responsibilities include:

- Expand our fundraising to reach new funders, including corporate, major, and small foundations; government agencies; and individuals.
- Develop and implement a communications strategy that advances our mission and promotes Pericleans' inspiring work to a range of audiences including academics, civic thought leaders, donors, and the public. This includes overseeing website, e-newsletter, and other materials.
- Manage budget and finances of the organization.
- Direct the development of grant proposals, narrative and financial reports, and other reports to foundations, college presidents, and the Board of Directors.
- Collaborate with and maintain strong relationships with our member colleges and universities and higher education more broadly.
- Direct portions of multi-year grant projects, Periclean programs, and national convenings associated with: The Periclean Faculty Leadership (PFL) Program™, The Periclean Voting Modules, and Debating for Democracy (D4D)™.

Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree required and authorization to work in the United States. Advanced degree preferred.
- Six or more years of experience in higher education, public policy, and/or non-profit organizations with demonstrated capacity for both leadership and creativity.

- Ability to manage and prioritize multiple projects and be a self-starter.
- Experience supervising others and managing projects.

- Excellent interpersonal and written communication skills.
- Experience in higher education, activism, civic engagement, social responsibility and/or social justice, and a desire to inspire faculty and empower student leaders.
